Things to Do



PLANT:

- Container grown Trees and shrubs

FERTILIZE:

- Feed all plantings and lawns with MicroLife or BioForm Dry.
- Greenhouse plants with earthworm castings.
- Houseplants, with earthworm castings.

PRUNE:

- Fruit trees: Apples to remove vertical shoots
- Evergreens to adjust appearance.
- Shade trees to remove any dead branches.
- Cut tops off of spent perennials. leave roots in ground.

WATER: If no rain, all planting areas.

PESTS:

- Bark Aphids: No treatment needed.
- Scale insects: on shade & fruit trees -Spray "Natural Oil".
- Spray houseplants: to control scale, mealybugs, spider mites, and other insects.

OTHER THINGS TO DO

- Check mowers.
- MULCH ALL BARE SOIL
- Turn Compost piles.
- Mow lawn no shorter than 3" inches. If lawn is cut shorter than 3" the roots will get shorter, which will put your lawn in decline. Weeds will then become an ongoing problem.
- Use a mulching mower to return nitrogen back to the soil..
