



Plant: Spring & summer flowering perennials. Cool season grasses and solid sod. Fall color: Pansies, dianthus & snapdragons.

FERTILIZE Foliar feed all plantings and lawns with Seaweed.

• Bulbs, annuals and perennials with earthworm castings. Indoor plants with Lava sand and earthworm castings. Add 1 teaspoon of natural apple cider vinegar to irrigation water per gallon.

PRUNE • Necessary tree pruning, remove dead limbs.

• Prune shrubs to remove longest shoots. • Remove spent flowers and seeds. • Cut off tops of brown perennials. Cover with native mulch. • Cut back tender herbs, such as lemon grass. Dig up stalks and put in a protective bright place - replant in spring. Can be left in ground in warm climates.

WATER: All planting area at least once, if no rain.

PESTS:

Brown patch in St. Augustine : Use corneal over infected area

Grubworms: Apply beneficial nematodes. Treat infected soil with biostimulants, molasses, compost.

Chinch bugs: Dust natural diatomaceous earth or spray with (fire ant control formula).

Aphids: Safer soap, or Garrett Juice & Garlic Barrier.

Fire Ants: Citrex, Broadcast orange or grapefruit peelings or pulp, Beneficial nematodes or try horticultural corn meal & molasses.

Chewing insects: Broadcast beneficial nematodes, dust natural diatomaceous earth or spray garrett juice with Garlic barrier add 2 ounces of orange oil per gallon for hard to control insects.
